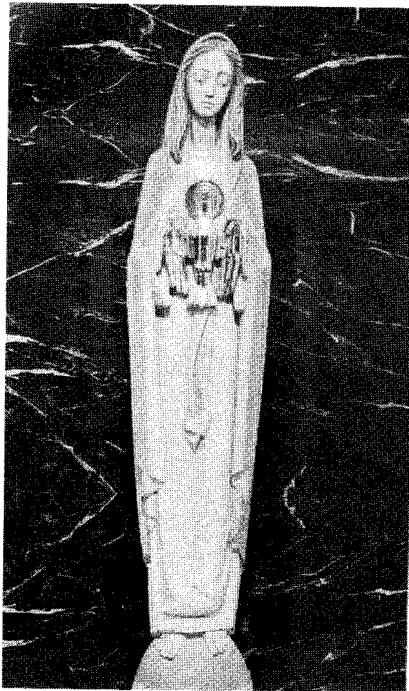
¶ NEXT SUNDAY

This past week was a busy one at St. Gertrude the Great. I am very grateful to Fr. Saavedra and all of his assistants (including of one our seminarians, Joseph Menges, from California) for another successful Boys' Camp. It would be difficult to imagine the immense amount of good done by such an apostolate for our youth. May God reward so many generous souls who worked to make this possible.

While Father was working with boys in Ohio, four more of our young Fathers in Florida were giving a five day retreat to teens and young adults, concluding this weekend with some nice social activities. I am particularly gratified that St. Gertrude the Great was so well represented this week at our seminary and the Sister's Motherhouse. Again, I am sure the good effects of this long needed work with youth will be many. I hope this becomes an annual tradition.

This weekend Fr. McGuire, one of the Florida retreat masters, joins Fr. Cekada at St. Gertrude, and I travel to Milwaukee for a pastoral visit and Confirmations.

My pastoral trip to Europe went very well, and I thank you for your prayers. Fr. Schoonbroodt is a wonderful priest and an example to us all. It was a pleasure to attend his Golden Sacerdotal Anniversary. Fr. Ramolla, my driver, and I were blessed with fine weather and, I must say, excellent food for our trip. For the rest of my journey, I have the impression of perhaps doing some good for our European brethren, who are small in number and suffer under the hegemony of the schismatic Society, as well as from the customary internal divisions. The visit of a bishop gives everyone the chance to complain, which can be quite cheering, as well as the encouraging occasion to remember that we are, after all, Catholics; part of the Church Universal, spread throughout the world, and that the victory will one day be ours.

Sanctify these last days of the month of the Precious Blood by offering it to the Father at a weekday Mass. You will thus demonstrate both and deepen your Faith, and give great power to your good prayers.

St. Martha, busy but no longer troubled, comes on Tuesday with St. Anthony, and the great Soldier of Christ, Ignatius of Layola, closes the month on Thursday. St. Peter's Chains, the great Cathedral feast for Cincinnati, coincides with First Friday. First Saturday of the month of the Immaculate Heart of Mary should move us out of routine and so the communion rail to offer our reparation.

Today the fathers are blessing cars. Drive safely. St. Christopher and the great Archangel Raphael be with you.
