June 28th – St. Anthony, powerful

threaten us in account of our sins.

July 5th – St. Anthony, who
drivest away devils, make us
triumph over their snares.

July 12th – St. Anthony, lily of
heavenly purity, purify us from the
stains of the soul, and preserve our
bodies from all danger.

July 19th – St. Anthony, healer of
the sick, cure our diseases and
preserve us in health.

July 26th – St. Anthony, guide of
travellers, bring to safe harbour
those who are in danger of
perishing, and calm the troubled
waves of passion which agitate our
souls.

August 2nd – St. Anthony, liberator of captives, deliver us from the captivity of evil.

August 9th – St. Anthony, who restorest to young and old the use of their limbs, obtain for us the perfect use of the senses of our body and the faculties of our soul.

August 16th – St. Anthony, finder of lost things, help us to find all that we have lost in the spiritual and in the temporal order.

August 23rd – St. Anthony, protected by Mary, avert the dangers which threaten our body and our soul.

August 30th – St. Anthony, helper of the poor, help us in our needs and give bread and work to those who ask.

September 6th – St. Anthony, we thankfully proclaim thy miraculous power, and we beseech thee to protect us all the days of our life.
