

PATRON SAINT OF WRITERS ST. FRANCIS DE SALES

Also called the Gentle Christ of Geneva. Francis de Sales was born in Savoy in 1567. His family was well-to-do and his parents wanted him to carry on the family's fine standing by becoming a lawyer and entering the political arena. He granted their wish, and after intense education he returned home a doctor of law and took a position in the Senate. However, Francis heard a voice one day that told him to leave everything he had worked for so he could follow the Lord. He joined the priesthood, and in time his family accepted his life change. Francis then became a spiritual writer and spiritual director in the district of Chablais, which is why he is considered the patron of writers.

May the Lord guide me and all those who love to write. Through your prayers, St. Francis de Sales, I ask for your intercession as I attempt to bring the written word to the world. Let us pray that God takes me in the palm of His hand and inspires my creativity and supports my success. St. Francis de Sales, you understand the dedication required in this profession.

CANDLEMAS DAY

The festival which we celebrate on the second of February is also called CANDLEMAS DAY. Ιt Candlemas Day because wax tapers or candles are solemnly blessed by the priest and carried in procession on this day. The feast with its procession dates back to the earliest days of the Church. Mention of this feast is made by Pope Gelasius I, in 494. St. Bernard in a sermon on this day, says: "This holy procession was made first by the Virgin Mary, Mother of Jesus, St. Joseph, Holy Simeon, and St. Anne." He also adds: "They walk two by two holding in their hands lighted candles, first blessed by the priest in church, and singing praises of the Lord because great is His Glory,"

Candles will be blessed for this solemn occasion at the High Mass.



St. Blaise- February 3rd Blessing of the Throats

The third of this month is the Feast of St. Blaise, Patron of Throats. St. Blaise, was Bishop of Sebaste in Armenia, who died as a martyr in 316. His remains were transferred to Paris where a church was erected in his honor. He is considered to be one of the wonder workers. The faithful call upon him in diseases of the throat and teeth. According to some authors, while St. Blaise was in prison he kept a young boy who had a fish bone lodged in his throat from choking to death. The blessing of St. Blaise is given with two candles formed in the cross of St. Andrew.

During the blessing of throats on this day, the Church prays over her children by the lips of the priests: "Through the intercession of St. Blaise, Bishop and Martyr, may God deliver thee from troubles of the throat, and from other evil, in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit."

Blessing of throats will take place after each Mass.
