

Toddler Tips: Mothers, Do Not Despair

A lot of things change when you have your first baby, including your experience of going to church.

For the most part babies are easy to soothe and you will be able to pray during Mass. Then one day your sweet, easy to soothe baby at church turns into a toddler.

The toddler prefers to be moving continually throughout all of Mass, and she does not quite grasp the concept of a whisper. Sometimes she throws herself across the pew and announces loudly, "I AM A FISH!" Other times she repeats, "Donuts? Donuts?" for the entire hour. All the time you are either pacing in back, struggling in the pew, or resigned to sitting in the vestibule. And you ask yourself, what happened to praying at church?

Well, have no fear! Here are a few ideas to help you learn how to pray while tending to toddlers at Mass:

1) Don't stress about the quality of your prayer

Prayer is different now that you have a toddler to take care of. You are not going to be able to kneel with your eyes closed focusing on every word.

But you can be mindful of what is happening in the Mass, and work on being calm. If you were called to contemplative prayer at every Mass, then you would not be taking care of a toddler. (To be continued)

THE SABBATINE PRIVILEGE

In Britain, there is an organization called the Lord's Day Observance Society that campaigns for Sundays to be set apart from the other days of the week... Surely, people can go one day a week without feverish activity. The man who does not know how to do nothing seldom knows how to do anything.

Let me be honest and reveal my prejudices: Whenever I see the crowds shopping on Sundays, or on any other day, for that matter, I wonder what on earth they are shopping for. The sight never fails to depress me. Either they already have everything they need, or they can't afford anything more. What is it that they are seeking? Happiness through a pair of shoes, contentment through a pair of jeans? They wander down the shopping streets looking like carnivorous sheep, lost but ready to attack.

They are not even very good at shopping, to judge by the things they buy and already wear. In fact, they buy the same things over and over again—for example, pairs of jeans. They supposedly see differences in them, if only in the names of the brands attached to them. Talk about the narcissism of small differences! And *small* isn't the word for it.

Go down any shopping street in any Western country and count the proportion of elegantly dressed people. You will be lucky if it is one in a hundred. Everyone else will look like a slob or a slattern. There are worse things than to be badly dressed (Editor's note: immodesty!), I suppose, but

to be badly dressed *and* to spend a large portion of one's spare time choosing the clothes in which to be badly dressed—well, it has taken the age we live in to promote such a bizarre and perverse mass phenomenon. What kind of person spends hours choosing what he could buy in about a minute with no discernible difference to the aesthetic outcome?





TODAY WHEN we consider the major countries of the world we see that in many cases the official leaders are also the leaders in actuality: Vladimir Putin calls the shots in Russia, Xi



Jinping and his top Politburo colleagues do

the same in China, and so forth. An obvious problem with installing puppet rulers is the risk that they will attempt to cut their strings, much like Putin soon outmaneuvered and exiled his oligarch patron Boris Berezovsky. One means of minimiz-

ing such risk is to select puppets who are so deeply



compromised that they can never break free, knowing that the political self-destruct charges buried deep within their pasts could easily be triggered if they sought independence.

Perhaps the cause of this bizarre situation merely lies in the remarkable incompetence and cowardice of our major media organs, their herd mentality and their insouciant unwillingness to notice evidence that is staring them in the face.

But sometimes they drop hints, the media do, the "revelation of the method." For some politicians, the



false cover story invented to distract

from the truth, takes on an entire life of its own. Government by myth... (We see this almost every day. –Ed.)

Without the oil of


Love's transcendent Source.
