JESUS CONQUERS SATAN

A man's triumph over another is complete when he conquers him not only in the open field, but attacks him in his stronghold and deprives him of his kingdom and even of his dwelling place. Now, Christ had triumphed over the devil and had conquered him on the cross. Thus He said: Now is the judgment of the world; now shall the prince of this world be cast out (Jn 12:31).

And, therefore, that His victory might be complete, it was His will to deprive the devil of his throne and imprison him in his own house, which is hell. For this reason He descended into hell, deprived the devil of his own, bound him, and carried off his spoils: Despoiling the principalities and powers, He hath exposed them confidently, openly triumphing over them in Himself (Col 2:15).

Moreover, since Christ has been given power and possession in heaven and on earth, He wished to take possession of hell, so that, to quote the Apostle, In the name of Jesus every knee should bow of those that are in heaven, on earth, and under the earth (Phil 2:10).

No matter how great a man's afflictions may be, he should always hope in God's assistance and trust in Him.... So if Christ freed those who were in hell, anyone—provided he is a friend of God—should be confident that God will deliver him from his straits whatever they are.... And seeing that God gives special assistance to His servants, anyone who serves God should be full of confidence: He that feareth the Lord shall tremble at nothing; he shall not be afraid, for He is his hope (Sir 34:14).

Then will Satan and the Antichrist have their hour, their last hour of darkness upon the earth. For they and their wicked followers will suddenly disappear into the never-ending darkness of eternal perdition.

Sure, 'twas a grand St. Patrick's Day! Fr. McKenna remarked that there is always something special about March 17, but this year it seemed especially so; in church and outside: the beautifully decorated shrine, the shamrocks, the beloved minor key hymns... And then Helfta Hall made Irish for the day, all in green, even the donuts, and shamrocks galore, each preaching the Blessed Trinity. The welcoming hall was packed for between the Masses and for the ever so charming school program "Shillelaghs and Shamrocks," with one beautiful tune after another, so touchingly sung by the children. Some of us were able to stay to thank God for the day by singing the Vespers, but it was not over yet. An excellent attendance of late for the 5:45 permitted more souls to hear the "Mass of the Irish." It was this Mass, our Mass, for which the children of St. Patrick suffered for four long centuries, and which sustained them when reduced to serfdom and virtual slavery.

Only two days later came good St. Joseph, great St. Joseph. His altar has been gleaming golden with Spring flowers all March. Illness prevented a Solemn High Mass, however the surviving Fathers ably assisted me at the altar. But they were not the only ones. potential future roof repair. Or not. Please pray with me to St. Agatha for its restoration.



JOSÉ SÁNCHEZ DEL RÍO († 1928)

From 1926 to 1929, the long-oppressed Mexican Catholics took up arms against their government. The Cristeros were named from their distinctive cry, *Viva Cristo Rey!* "Long live Christ the King!" Fourteen-year-old José Sánchez del Río begged his mother to be able to join them: "Mama, do not let me lose the opportunity to gain heaven so easily and so soon." She finally relented.

José became a flag-bearer. In June, 1928, he was captured in the midst of a battle and imprisoned in the nearby sacristy of a church. He spent his days praying the rosary and wrote a heartfelt letter to his family. At one point, the soldiers forced José to watch the execution of a fellow Cristero. José told the prisoner, "You will be in heaven before me. Prepare a place for me. Tell Christ the King I shall be with Him soon."

On the night of February 10, soldiers cut off the bottoms of José's feet and ordered him to march. They drove him forward with strokes from their bayonets; a trail of bloody footprints marked his progress. When he reached the cemetery, José was given one last chance to save himself by declaring "Death to Christ the King." "I will never give in," he responded, "Viva Cristo Rey!" As the soldiers pierced him repeatedly, José traced a cross in the ground, knelt, and kissed it. The commander then shot him to death.

Please note these important dates:

First Confessions & Testing: Saturday, April 27th.

(Baptismal certificate must be already presented, and registration form completed before the test. Contact the church office for the necessary form.)

Children's Day of Recollection: Thursday, June 6th.

Confirmations: Vigil of Pentecost, Saturday, June 8th.

First Holy Communion: Pentecost Sunday, June 9th.

Please note the following:

If your child was **not** baptized at St. Gertrude the Great, the baptismal certificate must be submitted to the church office by **Saturday**, **March 30th**. If your child is not enrolled in the school or in Sunday catechism, please let us know if you are planning on bringing him to be tested on April 27th.

Children and parents must be attending Mass (and the children Catechism Class) every Sunday, not once or twice a month as sports or Sunday activities permit, in order to receive the Sacraments.

No child will be tested without his Baptismal Certificate and form filled out.

Sponsors must be members of St. Gertrude the Great, or a church affiliated with us. Please ask if you have a question.


PRAYER TO SAINT BENEDICT FOR A HAPPY DEATH

We declare then, first of all, that the Church is one: Credo unam Ecclesiam. In the Canticle of Canticles, we have Our Lord Himself calling her: My ONE;—ONE is My Dove, My perfect one is but ONE (Cantic. vi. 8). — She is, moreover, Holy: Credo SANCTAM Ecclesiam. We hear the divine Spouse again saying in the same Canticle: My Love, My Dove, My Beautiful one,....there is not a spot in thee (Ibid. ii. 10; iv. 7). Writing to the Ephesians, St. Paul likewise says, that the Church which Our Lord presented unto Himself, is a glorious Church, not having spot or wrinkle (Eph. v. 27); therefore, the Church of Christ is Holy, there are no Holy ones, no Saints, but within her, and there are always Holy ones, Saints, within her. Moreover, being Holy, she cannot teach aught but the truth.—The Church is Catholic: Credo Ecclesiam Catholicam; that means, she is universal, because she is spread throughout the whole earth, and because she will continue to exist to the end of time; now both of these are included in the quality of catholicity.

MONDAY IN LENT III

At the Preface.



Reflect that the very same Jews who, five days before, saluted Christ with hosannas, now cry out, "Crucify Him, crucify Him." – John xix. 6. Art thou guilty of similar in-

constancy? "Perfect Thou my goings in Thy paths; that my footsteps be not moved." – Ps. xvi. 5.

At the Preface.

Jesus is condemned to death. Lord Jesus Christ! Who though the God of all sanctity, didst submit, through love for me, to a most ignominious condemnation, grant me grace to avoid rash judgments, and strengthen me to bear with patience the injustice of men. "Strengthen Thou me in Thy words." – Ps. cxviii. 28.

Resolve. In honor of Jesus carrying His cross, to assist others in their hard work.

TUESDAY IN LENT III

At the Preface.

Jesus our Victim. Lift up your hearts! Let us raise our minds and hearts, and so penetrate into the soul of our Redeemer. Knowing that the hour for His departure out of this world is at



hand, He renews the offering of Himself which He made at His birth: "Behold, I come." It is true then, my Father, that the blood of the holocausts for sin does not please Thee. Thy justice calls for mine. Behold me, Thy Victim. Divine Jesus! Grant that I may acknowledge the mystery of Thy love by a generous devotedness to the interests of Thy Blood in souls, and by offering it my ceaseless thanksgiving. It is truly meet, just and salutary to render Thee an unceasing tribute of gratitude and love.

Resolve. To practice some devotion in honor of the Mother of God, and to console the afflicted.

Pray. O dearest Mother, assist me in every trial, anguish, and want.

WEDNESDAY IN LENT III

At the Canon.

Meditate upon Jesus bearing His own cross as He went up to Calvary. – John xix. 17. Dost thou not hear the voice of Christ? "If any man will come after Me, let him



deny himself, and take up his cross, and follow Me." – *Matt. xvi. 24*.

Jesus Carries His Cross. Lord Jesus Christ! Who didst carry Thy heavy cross for my salvation, grant that I may voluntarily embrace the cross of mortification, and carry it daily for Thy love. "Draw me: we will run after Thee to the odor of Thy ointments." – Cant. i. 3.

"God forbid that I should glory, save in the cross of Our Lord Jesus Christ." – Gal. vi. 14.

"Let us go forth therefore to Him without the camp, bearing His reproach." – *Heb. xiii. 13*.

Resolve. Not to eat out of meal-time, not to sit down without necessity, if fatigued.

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Pray. O my Jesus, for Thy sake change for me all earthly sweetness into bitterness.

THURSDAY IN LENT III

At the Sanctus.

The holy women and Veronica. Consider that you have a double cause to weep—both for Jesus who suffers so much for you, and for yourself who ungratefully offends Him so often. How can you



remain unmoved at the sight of such suffering?

Veronica wipes with a linen cloth the Face of Jesus. Lord Jesus Christ! Who on Thy way to Calvary, didst say to the holy women that wept for the love of Thee, "Weep not for me, but for yourselves;" give me the grace to weep for my sins with tears of holy contrition and love that will render me agreeable to Thy divine Majesty.

Resolve. To suffer patiently the inclemencies of the weather.

Pray. Forgive me, O my Savior, for having so delicately treated my body.

FRIDAY IN LENT III THE FIVE HOLY WOUNDS

At the Te Igitur and Communicantes.

Jesus is stripped. O Holy of Holies, before fastening Thee to the wood of sacrifice, the executioners tear Thy garments from Thee. What a terrible humiliation! What a cruel outrage to be offered to the Son of the Virgin! And yet, alas! It must needs be endured that the world may know



that it has lost the robe of innocence; that we all need Christ's merits wherewith to cover, as with a garment, our spiritual nakedness.

Resolve. Not to lean against anything when

seated, or—when not observed—to pray with outstretched arms.

Pray. O Lord, suffer not Thy great pains to be in vain for me.

SATURDAY IN LENT III

At the Memento for the Living.

The soldiers divide Our Lord's garments. By the Blood which gushed from Thy innumerable wounds, re-opened by the brutality of the soldiers, beautify my soul with Thy merits. Blood of Jesus, sole hope of the



Christian, cover us all with Thy regenerating virtue; especially do Thou clothe therewith those poor souls who shall, this day, ask of Thee the vestment of glory and immortality. Apply Thy infinite merits likewise to my relatives, brethren, benefactors, friends and enemies: and be Thou their portion much better than Thy garments were the portion of the deicide soldiery.

Resolve. Most willingly to return good for injuries received.

Pray. O Lord, how much more hast Thou forgiven me, than I have forgiven my neighbor!

FOURTH SUNDAY OF LENT

A Memento Prayer

Remember, O Lord, in Thy mercy, all those for whom I am bound to pray in justice and charity. I beseech Thee to bless my family and my

I pray to Thee also, in a particular manner, O my God, for the Church, my tender mother, and all the clergy. Shed over all Thy abundant benedictions; give to all of us hearts according to Thy Heart, uniting us all in the same holy fellowship.

Heart of Jesus, praying and suffering, I adore Thee, and beseech Thee to unite my prayers with Thine.

Heart of Jesus, lamenting and agonizing, I adore Thee, and beseech Thee to fill my heart with sorrow for my sins.

Heart of Jesus, offering Thyself in sacrifice to the eternal Father, I adore Thee, and beseech Thee to offer me in sacrifice with Thyself.

Resolve. Not to drink out of meals.

Pray. May the Blood of Jesus Christ be given me to drink and to cleanse me from my sins.
