As thou didst live in holy harmony and peace with St. Joachim, so may love, union, devotion, and zeal for virtue reign in my household, that we may belong to that host of blessed spouses who with you will love, praise, and glorify the Most High for ever and ever. Secret: "Be appeased by these sacrifices, and consider them, O Lord, we beseech Thee, that by the intercession of blessed Anne, who was mother of her that brought forth Thy Son, our Lord Jesus Christ, they may advance both our piety and our health."

There is a close connection between St. Anne and the sacrifice of the cross; because that human nature and that blood which Jesus offered up on the cross and which He received from the most pure womb of Mary was, in her turn, derived from her own holy mother St. Anne, in whose womb she was conceived without original sin.

The Communion comes from Psalm xliv: "Grace is poured abroad in thy lips: therefore God blessed thee for ever, and for ages and ages."

The grace which St. Anne brought into the world is the blessed Virgin Mary. Grace is also poured abroad in her lips because, as mother and grandmother, she must have imprinted so any kisses upon the face of Mary and the infant Jesus. It is in order to bring forward this specially intimate relationship of St. Joachim and St. Anne with the Savior that the Greeks give them the glorious title of "grandparents of God."

WHY THE HAIL MARY BEFORE THE SERMON?

Blessed Alan says: "All priests say a Hail Mary with the faithful before preaching, to ask for God's grace. They do this because of a revelation that St. Dominic had from Our Lady. 'My son,' she said one day, 'do not be surprised that your sermons fail to bear the results you had hoped for. You are trying to cultivate a piece of ground which has not had any rain. Now when Almighty God planned to renew the face of the earth He started by sending down rain from heaven—and this was the Angelic Salutation. In this way God made over the world."

The Hail Mary is a sharp and flaming shaft which, joined to the Word of God, gives the preacher the strength to pierce, move and convert the most hardened hearts even if he has little or no natural gift for preaching.

As I have already said, this was the great secret that Our Lady taught Saint Dominic and Blessed Alan so that they might convert heretics and sinners.

Saint Antoninus tells us that this is why many priests got into the habit of saying a Hail Mary at the beginning of their sermons.


Thank you for your presence, your prayers and frequent Mass attendance, and your continuing support in these so difficult days.

MAN INVOKES 'RELIGIOUS EXEMPTION' TO REFUSE MASK AT KROGER

This is a very good video. (You can access it at https://nofacemask.blogspot.com/2020/07/man-invokes-religious-exemption-to.html)

[This man] successfully invokes a 'religious exemption' for face masks and refers to the 1964 civil rights act (a federal law). This gentleman serves as a very good example for others on how to deal effectively with store management. He successfully asserted his rights confidently, yet calmly, without getting into a volatile confrontation.

Notice how the female store clerk touches, rubs and adjusts the front of her mask countless times during their conversation before the manager arrives. A study proves that the outside of the face mask has the most germs on it. As Dr. David Lang of Wisconsin points out, a face mask is "basically a giant Petri dish you have strapped to your face."

"Respiratory pathogens on the outer surface of the used medical masks may result in self-contamination. The risk is higher with longer duration of mask use... Respiratory pathogens may be present on used masks layers and lead to infection of the wearer... While using masks, or during long periods of time of re-using them, these pathogens may cause infection through hand or skin contamination, ingestion, or mucus membrane contact."

As one YouTube commenter so aptly points out, "As she touches her mask 10-15 times during the conversation, her hands on her face/mask, then she's handing out masks to others her germs on the masks contaminating them! Pure insanity. She's hot and fanning her face because she can't breathe!"

This is a legal notice of my religious immunity for a mandatory face mask/covering policy/mandate attempting to be imposed upon me at your place of public accommodation.

Per Title II of H.R. 7152, aka the Civil Rights Act of 1964, passed on Tuesday, the seventh day of January, one thousand nine hundred and sixty-four:

"Sec. 202. All persons shall be entitled to be free, at any establishment or place, from discrimination or segregation of any kind on the ground of race, color, religion, or national origin, if such discrimination or segregation is or purports to be required by any law, statute, ordinance, regulation, rule, or order of a State or any agency or political subdivision thereof.

Sec. 203. No person shall (a) withhold, deny or attempt to withhold or deny, or deprive or attempt to deprive, any person of any right or privilege secured by section 201 or 202, or (b) intimidate, threaten, or coerce, or attempt to intimidate, threaten, or coerce any person with the purpose of interfering with any right or privilege secured by section 201 or 202, or (c) punish or attempt to punish any person for exercising or attempting to exercise any right or privilege secured by section 201 or 202."

FOLLOW ME

And Jesus said to them, "Follow Me and I will make you become fishers of men." And immediately they left their nets and followed Him...Mark 1:17-18

"Follow Me!" Jesus says these words (...) to every Christian. Follow Me, naked as I am naked, free from every hindrance as I Myself am. Jeremiah said: "You will call Me 'My Father' and never turn away from Me" (Jer 3:19). So follow Me and put down the burdens you are bearing. For, laden as you are, you cannot follow Me who am running ahead. "I ran in thirst" says the psalmist about Me (Ps 61:5 LXX), the thirst to save humanity. And where is He running? To the Cross. You too, run after Him. As He bore His cross for you, take up your own for your good. From whence these words of Saint Luke's gospel: "If anyone wishes to come after Me, he must deny himself" by renouncing his own will, "take up his cross" by mortifying his passions, "daily", that is all the time, "and follow Me." (Lk 9:23) (...)

Jesus speaks to us like a mother who, wanting to teach her child to walk, shows him apiece of bread or an apple and says to him: "Come with me and I'll give it to you." And when the child is so close that he can almost catch hold of it, she draws away a little, showing the thing to him and repeating: "Follow me if you want it." Some kinds of birds lead their little ones out of their nest and, by flying, teach them to fly and to follow them. Jesus does the same. He shows Himself as an example and promises us His reward in the kingdom so that we might follow Him.

So "follow Me" for I know the right way and will guide you. We read in the book of Proverbs: "I will show you the way of wisdom; I will lead you by the ways of equity. When you have entered, your steps will not be constrained and when you run you shall not meet a stumbling block" (cf. Prv 4:11-12 LXX). (...) Therefore, "follow Me"."
