
¶THIS WEEK

A PASSIONTIDE PRAYER


Our Lord Jesus Christ our God, as Thou didst weep over Lazarus and shed tears of sadness and compassion for him, accept these bitter tears of mine.

- II. By the scourge that rent and tare Flesh divine in shame laid bare; By the blood that drenched the ground;


By the body one vast wound; By the stripes our healing made,— Jesus, hearken! Mary, aid!

Laetare, or Rejoice Week has been one of weddings and funerals, preparing for them, and carrying them out. Tuesday we had a Solemn Requiem for Eldon Neukam, token of our esteem and lasting gratitude to a good man who gave of himself year after year. Today I'm in Milwaukee due to a funeral yesterday for one of our first faithful, Helen Kalian, a real foundress of that church.

But green shone among the black this week: another glorious St. Patrick's Day with beautiful music, Solemn Mass, and an abundant *Italian* dinner. And why not? Many an Irish saint ended up in Italy, giving those good folk what only the Irish can give.

Friday's feast of St. Joseph has more of a universal character, for St. Joseph is the Patron of the Universal Church. But by yesterday afternoon he was shrouded in purple with all the rest for the Passion of Our Lord. Only his golden daffodils and green lights remind us it is still his month. And how fitting, for St. Joseph matches each of his Seven Joys with Seven Sorrows, which enabled him to suffer the Passion with his Son, by anticipation. In a different way, we do as well, anticipating the sad chronology of Holy Week, as well as the splendor of the Resurrection. Be sure to *anticipate* your Holy Week this week, by planning and preparing for your participation.

This is the last of our Lent, for Holy Week has its own spirit and schedule. The final "Short Stations" are this morning, Children's Stations on Wednesday, and the closing of Sorrowful Mother Novena on Friday, the final Recollection. Joyful news in times of sorrow: You can still get in on everything!

But let us not forget **Thursday**, which brings us to our knees in *Adoration* and takes us back to the beginning, the **Annunciation**. Against the Lenten purple the Sacred Ministers don Mary's colors, and another Solemn Mass is sung. Afterwards the Blessed Sacrament is exposed for a few precious hours until the early Vespers and Benediction. Last year we prayed for protection from the Plandemic. A year later, with so many falling victim to the "vaccine," we are still praying. Pray with us. Many adorers are needed from 12:30 until 3:00 PM, a kind of Tre Ore a week in advance. Friday is the feast of Mary's Seven Sorrows.

We ought to pray that this year-long plague of wicked plans, death and destruction, be brought to an end. There *are* stirrings of sense in our land. Will they make a difference? It will be a battle. St. Michael must both sheath and unsheathe his sword these days. Prayer is our weapon, our proven protection.

ST. ISIDORE, THE FARM-LABORER, CONFESSOR

March 22—Patron of farmers

St. Isidore was born at Madrid, Spain, in the latter half of the 12th century. For the greater part of his life he was employed as a laborer on a farm outside the city. Many marvelous happenings accompanied his lifelong work in the fields and continued long after his holy death. He was favored with celestial visions, and it is



said the angels sometimes helped him in his work in the fields. St. Isidore was canonized in 1622.

In 1947, he was proclaimed the patron of the National Rural Life Conference in the United States.

★ THE HOLY FACE **★**

As we began this article with...the spread of the devotion to the Holy Face as being a weapon against Communism, we remind you that Communism is far from being dead. The enemy does not sleep. Here is a quote from one Communist website called www.redsun.org, "...we are unfolding within the new era, initiated with the October Revolution in 1917, in the past century, which is grand and glorious, a great milestone. You may be disturbed by the fact that restoration has taken place in the USSR and in China, but this implies not seeing the struggle between restoration and counter-restoration... Communism will not be in one country; it will be in the entire world, or it will be not at all... We are inexorably marching toward it. Nobody take us off this course."

These words filled with ardent zeal for the spread of Communism are a reminder of what awaits us if we do not fight. We dare to say that we MUST take them off this course! With the Holy Face in one hand as our shield and Our Lady's rosary in the other as our weapon, we must march toward this final battle in which Our Lady will be triumphant and crush the serpent's head! For in this mystery of the Holy Face is the core theme— Reparation. A reparation for those who are attacking the Catholic Church from without AND within! This is a battle to the death—the death of Communism, the death of Masonry once and for all! Remember with the devotion of Our Lady of Good Success-she promises "good success" in all of our endeavors—we cannot fail!

When Communists took over China, the Chinese Catholics prayed the following prayer every day. Those who survived the mock trials of the Communists attributed their release to the power of this prayer said daily:

"O my God, I fear only my fear; it could make me abandon Thee. O my God, I fear only my fear; it could make me lose courage before the end. O my God, do not forget me in Thy Glory, but give me Thy Love and the strength to give my life for Thee. Amen."



In 1941. Our Lord asked Sr. Pierina if would she be willing to join Him in the agony of His Soul in Gethsemane for the sins "of those most dear to Me and especially for

the rebuffs I receive from the souls of many religious." Our Lord asked her in particular to make reparation for the sin of pride in religious souls. These last years were spent in doing just that. The "Kiss" that was to make reparation for the kiss of Judas now takes on a new meaning for her. For as Judas was a priest and a bishop of Christ, Our Lord, in His request, was asking Sr. Pierina to make reparation for all of the "Judases" of the world that were offending Him-most particularly religious "Judases." For you see, those apostles who betrayed Our Savior on Holy Thursday ran from the Holy Face. There was only one Apostle who did not run from it-St. John. Through that gallant act in which he stayed and comforted Our Lady as they watched Jesus throughout His Passion, St. John was given something none of the other apostles dared to receive, which was an active participation in His Passion. This active participation merited for him a fortification in his Faith and made him able to defend it as he stood beside Our Blessed Mother. In that gaze from the cross, Christ gave His Mother to us via St. John. This was one of the greatest gifts He could have given us short of a promise of Heaven.



We will leave you with this excerpt from a lecture given by Fr. Mateo Crawley-Bouvey, SS, SC, Apostle of the Sacred Heart.

"Are you really zealous? Are you really apostles of the Holy Face of Jesus? You must be the ones to set fire to their hearts. How many Catholics there are who have not grasped the duty of being apostles, the duty of gratitude! It is our positive duty—our obligation to bring others to Jesus, to give Him your care, lavishing this treasure on souls, on poor starving souls. It is sad that so few truly love Jesus."



OFFERING OF THE HOLY FACE BY ST. JOHN VIANNEY



REPARATION

MONDAY IN PASSION WEEK

Reparation is an ambiguous term. Even in profane use it may be employed in the sense of repair of a damaged object or an act of justice whereby payment of some sort of made for damage done. In religious use it has a variety of meanings. It means principally the work of redemption accomplished by Our Lord Jesus Christ, in the sense of "repairing the damage done" by Adam's revolt and the sin of his progeny; Christ restores us to God's friendship. The term is also used in a generic way to restitution for injuries, usually when moral theology cannot measure precisely what such payment would entail.

Reparation is the making of amends for insults given to God though sin, either one's own or another's. Through St. Margaret Mary's devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus—a devotion stemming through St. John Eudes back through Ss. Gertrude and Mechtilde and St. Francis' devotion to the Five Wounds and Passion of Christ, "reparation" took on a more distinctive meaning. St. Margaret Mary saw Christ's heart and His love ignored and ridiculed; the response of man is to be reparation through adoration, prayer, and sacrifice.

Heart of God, adorable Heart, Heart, the goal of all my love, O infinitely lovable Heart, Who loves me, loves me always.

Although so poor and wretched, Although the greatest sinner, I now make an act of reparation To Thy Heart so full of grandeur.

TUESDAY IN PASSION WEEK

The root "repair" is found in St. Louis Marie's writings about forty times in such terms as reparation, reparatrice, repairer, to repair. The object of this "reparation" may be creation, humanity, Heaven, the Honor of God, and of course scandals and injustices. In most cases Montfort does not use the word as contemporary spirituality defines it, as compensation for an outrage against love. Occasionally he refers to repair of church buildings, or for honoring the devil.

Pardon for all the unfaithful, Who, though created for Thee, Attack Thee, and damn themselves, Despite Thy paternal goodness.

> Pardon for the schismatics Estranged from Thy unity, Pardon for the heretics Who contradict Thy truth.

WEDNESDAY IN PASSION WEEK

The Blessed Virgin Mary, in unity with her Son, atones for the fallen world. Through her piety, Our Lady had "succeeded most worthily in atoning for the fallen universe." "Reparation" means restoring the universe and, in particular, healing the wounds of mankind caused by sin. When Adam became a slave of the demon and the object of God's anger, "nothing could restore his privileges." Wisdom, by whose word "everything was made and everything was restored," chose "to become man in order to restore that fallen humanity." In Mary, Jesus "has perfectly restored the glory" that sin had taken away from the Father. Mary, the "restorer of the human race," is completely united with the Son; as she gains the fidelity and perseverance of those who commit themselves to her, she "makes good the losses caused by Eve's unfaithfulness." According to Bl. Alan de la Roche, "who restored the devotion of the Rosary," "by this prayer [the Angelic Salutation] the whole world was restored." Through

the Angelic Salutation, the ruins of heaven have been repaired and "the empty thrones in heaven have been filled."

> Ah! pardon for their malice, Pardon for their scandal, Pardon for all their fury, Pardon for their cruelty.

Pardon, pardon, divine Heart, We forget Thee in the Tabernacle; Pardon for the ungodly Christian Who constantly profanes Thee.

THURSDAY IN PASSION WEEK

St. Louis de Montfort cites the example of the preacher who at one time had preached against the Rosary and then "publicly acknowledged his former error," and that of the women who had given herself to the devil and felt "an intense desire to make amends for this terrible deed." He called on the Daughters of Wisdom to make public reparation for their faults and invited them to atone for "the scandals of all of your brothers." We know that Montfort founded confraternities for the reparation of such public wrongs.

Ah! pardon for these insults, For these criminal rendezvous; Pardon for our irreverence Which stains Thy holy altars!

They pierce Thy very Heart, Which even the devil dare not do. For this perjury and blasphemy, Thy pardon, Lord, I pray.

FRIDAY IN PASSION WEEK SEVEN SORROWS OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN

The spirituality of St. Louis de Montfort led him down many different paths. He affirmed the goodness of Our Lord, Who is touched by the misery of fallen humanity. Divine Wisdom brought together the members of the Trinity, so

to speak, "for the purpose of rehabilitating man in the state He formerly created him." He also writes of the love that is ridiculed by all, even by Christians, and he discusses the satisfactory value of atonement for sins committed. Like St. Margaret Mary, he affirms the response of love to the gift of love—but St. Louis de Montfort sees this as a total, all-inclusive response. It refers not to specific practices of atonement, such as on the First Friday, but to making a complete gift of oneself, a consecration. To make such a gift is in St. Louis de Montfort's view the ideal in any Christian life; and although he never explicitly mentions it, reparation would certainly be encompassed by this gift.

Pardon for the wayward priests And all Thy hidden foes; Pardon for a thousand traitors Who receive Thee, though in sin.

Alas! Thy life is shattered In many hearts, despite Thy love; Alas! They crucify Thee there. O weep my eyes; O flow my tears.

SATURDAY IN PASSION WEEK

He does not discuss reparation specifically when he speaks of the works undertaken by the friends of Wisdom "for the glory of God and the salvation of souls," nor when he explains why the Cross is "precious" and why we should consecrate ourselves to Jesus through Mary, nor even when he explains how consecration gives greater glory to Jesus Christ. But this act of consecration does indeed contain an element of reparation. In this act we in effect acknowledge how much Wisdom has done for us through love, and, simultaneously, we acknowledge our own unfaithfulness. By offering ourselves through the mediation of Mary, we are truly honoring Jesus Christ, because "we are showing that, because of our sins, we are unworthy to approach His infinite holiness directly on our own."

Pardon for the cowardly souls Who sleep next to Thine altars; Who, by their hearts so sullied, Incite Thy Heart to vomit.
