





PASSIONTIDE

Today, in Passiontide, we pause to reflect in an especial manner upon the sufferings and death of the God-Man. We rededicate our lives as Christians to follow Him along the Way of the Cross.

In an age where speed is the predominant note of our lives and where daily distraction steals away many precious moments, it is important for us to pause, to reflect and to pray over the true values of life. The speed of our day is not just a note intrinsically bound up with the machine age in which we are living. It is rather a note and characteristic of men's souls and dispositions. It is a personality factor. In such an environment there is danger lest we place false emphasis on action only and entirely overlook prayer.

Passiontide beckons us to do a few things significant for our souls' welfare. We can read this week at least once the gospel story of the Passion of our Lord. We can meditate on the sufferings of Christ as we make the Way of the Cross. We can reflect on the sorrowful mysteries of the Rosary as we recite our Lady's beads, and we can join our wills with Christ's will by a patient acceptance of the will of God in our behalf.

The forty days are spent.


For one thing, he can go to Mass Before it's time for school, And he can try his very best To keep each little rule.



★ THE BISHOP'S NOTE **★**

Spring has arrived! The cherry blossom trees have begun blooming and the different critters of God's creation have returned from warmer climates. In recent days, I've noticed a variety of birds in the garden. Which reminds me! the Killdeer should be back soon. They are some of the most interesting birds we have on the property. They lay their eggs in the rocks (the eggs actually blend in quite well there), and if a person gets too close them the mother or father comes swooping down and acts injured, dragging its wing on the ground walking away from the nest in the hopes that the intruder will follow it. I have seen this many times. They also dive-bomb the cats and have chased them under the cars.



The Young children found a small garter snake in their yard on Wednesday and brought it to Miss Mikesell's class for the day. William got bit when he picked it up in his yard, but said it didn't really hurt. The Youngs gave it a name which I cannot remember at the moment, but Miss Mikesell changed its

name to Jimothy for the day. Hands-on science lessons are always fun!

Many of our servers are moving up in the ranks now. **Fr. Lehtoranta** has been overseeing the school children's training while Michael Simpson oversees that of the homeschool children. There will always be some mischief even in good Catholic schools, as can be seen from the life of this saint. If children are taught Catholic discipline and virtue at home they will know how to deal with the bad example of companions in school, with the help of teachers and clergy of the school. While Catholic educators limit bad influences as much as they can, it cannot be prevented a hundred percent of the time. Just take a look at St.

John Bosco's Oratory for examples. However, the good example of one good child can go a long way!

MONDAY IN PASSION WEEK

Meditation: "My child, remember that the soul that loves Jesus speaks little and suffers much. I order you, in the name of Jesus, never to give your opinion unless asked, and never to hold onto your opinion, but to yield." And he further added: "When you have committed any fault, acknowledge it immediately, without waiting to be questioned. Remember to guard your eyes, for eyes that are mortified will look upon the beauty of Heaven."

Practice: Refrain from criticizing the faults of another. This will please your Angel very much and will be written down in the Book of Life.

TUESDAY IN PASSION WEEK

Meditation: Now devotion to the angels contributes marvelously to the perfection of divine love, and consequently to the increase of the glory of Heaven. These spirits are living flames of pure love; it is not possible to approach them often without taking fire and sharing their ardor. With the saints we become sanctified, with the angels we become all-angelic, that is to say, all-heavenly. It is the property of love to assimilate those persons who love each other. Now they cannot become like to us; their purity is incorruptible. It is necessary, then, that we should become like to them.

Practice: Say the *Angelus* morning, noon, and night in honor of St. Gabriel the Archangel. Ask him to help you to imitate him in his tender devotion to Our Lady.



WEDNESDAY IN PASSION WEEK

Meditation: When a person thinks seriously that on the moment of death depends a happy or miserable eternity, his heart must be obdurate, indeed, if he be not struck with fear: for if the just be scarcely saved, where will the sinner appear? O, Lord! enter not into judgment with Thy servant, for no one living is justified in Thy sight! The holy abbot Agatho, being seized with trembling at his last hour, and his religious having asked him the cause—he replied that though, by the great mercy of God, his conscience did not reproach him with anything, yet that the divine judgment being very different from those of men he was in great alarm. No wonder he should have felt so-all our good works are imperfect in the sight of the Divine Majesty. If the Angels succor us in this dread moment, do they not prove themselves our true friends? It is in the time of affliction a person knows a sincere friend; and behold in the hour of death, when all abandon us to our fate, when our bodies are consigned to the solitary tomb, and our soul "goes to the house of its eternity," the Angels, faithful to their charge, never depart from us.

Practice: Say a prayer to the Guardian Angel of one who is soon to die. The angels are very ready to assist the dying.

THURSDAY IN PASSION WEEK

Meditation: Heretics and Infidels have angels who guard them, though their sin be so incomprehensible, that we can never in this world attain anything like a notion of it. The Turks, the professed enemies of the Christian name, have their angels—nay, Antichrist himself will have an Angel Guardian, says St. Thomas, who will hinder him from committing several evils. – *Devotion to the Holy Angels*

Practice: Admire the wonderful mercies of God in acting in this manner towards even the worst of sinners. Pray to the Guardian Angels of heretics, and even to the Guardian Angel who has the very difficult duty of being with the Antichrist. Ask these angels to preserve us from the harm of evildoers.

FRIDAY IN PASSION WEEK THE SEVEN SORROWS OF OUR LADY

Meditation:

Where is the friend who would continue to demonstrate his friendship, after repeated insults and affronts? Yet all the injuries, revolts, contempt and ingratitude of Men diminish not in the least degree the charity of these blessed Spirits. They go to seek



them in the forests of Canada, in the remotest deserts, in the most gloomy caverns, at the extremities of the earth. You would say that they are beside themselves with love for Men, who have nothing of Man but the shape and appearance, their lives being wholly earthly and sensual. These celestial beauties give their affections to deformity itself, and yet meet with no other return than ingratitude and contempt. – *Devotion to the Holy Angels*

Practice: Invoke the Guardian Angels on behalf of those souls who ignore their wonderful companion whom God has given them.

SATURDAY IN LENT IV

Meditation: "A man's soul," says St Bernard, "is sometimes thrown into such great disorder, his mind is overcome with such distressing weariness, his heart is oppressed with such excruciating anguish, his body is so grievously afflicted, and the besetting temptation is so urgent, that without a powerful help he would succumb. At such a time," continues this Father, "it needs the assistance of the angels: it needs the consolation of these spirits of Heaven; in its present languid state it would be unable to walk; it is needful, then, that the angels should carry it in their arms. I hold as most certain that when the soul is in this condition, they support it, so to say, with both hands, bearing it so gently through all those perils which inspired it with most dread, that in some sort it feels them without perceiving them. We have to walk upon asps and basilisks; we have to tread under foot lions

and dragons; how necessary, then, is it that we should have the angels for our masters and guides! how needful it is that they should even carry us—us especially, who are like weak children! But how easily do we traverse these dangerous roads when borne in their arms! What do we fear? They are faithful, they are wise, they are powerful: let us but follow them, and never separate ourselves from them. Whenever, therefore, you are suffering from some great temptation or affliction, have recourse to your good angel; say to him, 'My lord, save me, save me! for I am on the point of being lost."

Practice: Dear Guardian Angel, help me to bear my cross in union with Our Lord.

PALM SUNDAY

A great multitude that was met together at the festival cried out to the Lord: Blessed is He that cometh in the Name of the Lord! Hosanna in the highest! – Antiphon of Palm Sunday

Meditation: The Procession is now on its return to the church: but it cannot enter, for the doors are shut. We have already explained the meaning of this part of the ceremony. Immediately, there are heard voices within the holy place; they are singing the praises of Christ, our King and Savior. These chanters represent the holy Angels in heaven, who are greeting the Entry of Jesus into the eternal Jerusalem. Outside the church, there stands the choir, re-echoing the hymn of triumph; but it is man celebrating the Entry of the Son of David into the earthly Jerusalem. The two Choirs are thus kept separated from each other, until, at length, the victorious Cross throws open the door, which represents the gate of heaven, and unites the Church Militant with the Church Triumphant.

Practice: Ask the Church Triumphant to assist the Church Militant to fight for God's glory on earth and to attain the glories of heaven.
