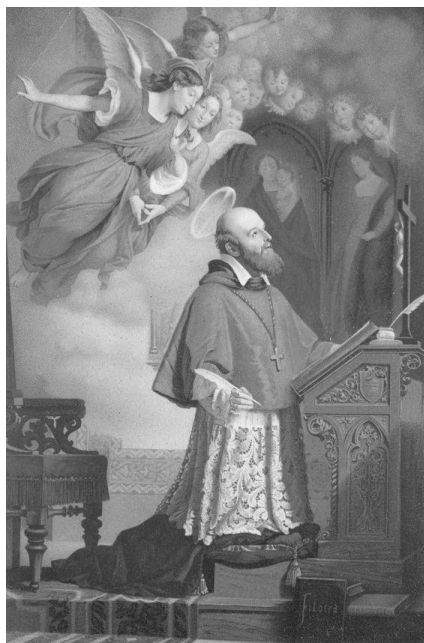

ETERNITY

They pass away, these temporal years, my brother; their months melt into weeks, weeks into days, days into hours, and hours into moments, which last are all we possess: and these we only possess as they perish and make up our perishable life. This life, however, must on this account be more dear to us, since being full of misery, we cannot have any more solid consolation therein than that of being assured that it gradually disappears to make room for that holy eternity which is prepared for us in the abundance of God's mercy. To this eternity our soul aspires incessantly by the continual thoughts its very nature suggests to it, though it cannot have hope for eternity except by other and higher thoughts which the Author of nature bestows upon it.

Truly, my brother, I never think of eternity without much sweetness; for, say I, how could my soul extend its thought to this infinity unless it has some kind of proportion with it? Certainly, a faculty which attains an object must have some sort of correspondence with it. But when I find that my desire runs after my thought upon this same eternity, my joy takes an unparalleled increase, for I know that we never desire, with a true desire, anything which is not possible. My desire then assures me that I can have eternity: What remains for me but to hope that I shall have it? And this is given to me by the knowledge of the infinite goodness of Him Who would not have created a soul capable of thinking of and tending toward eternity, unless He has intended to give the means of attaining it. Thus, my brother, we shall find ourselves at the foot of the crucifix, which is the ladder by which from these temporal years we pass to the eternal years.

✠ PASCHAL SACRAMENTS

Please note these important dates:

First Confessions & Testing: Saturday, April 18. (Baptismal certificate must be already presented, and registration form completed *before* the test. Contact the church office for the necessary form.)

Confirmands' Day of Recollection (for Children): Thursday, May 21

Confirmations: Vigil of Pentecost, Saturday, May 23

First Communion: Corpus Christi Sunday, June 7

Parents, please note: the Baptismal certificates of children not baptized at St. Gertrude the Great **must be submitted to the church office by Saturday, March 28.** If your child is not enrolled in the school or in Sunday catechism, please let us know if you are planning on bringing him to be tested on April 18.

It is sometimes difficult to know if the children are ready, but if they know their basics, and are reverent at Mass, they probably are! Please speak with Bishop McGuire.

Please note the following:

Children and parents must be attending Mass (and the children Class) **every Sunday**, not once or twice a month as sports or Sunday activities permit, in order to receive the Sacraments.

No child will be tested without his Baptismal Certificate and form filled out.

Sponsors must be members of St. Gertrude the Great, or a church affiliated with us. Please ask if you have a question.

Thanks be to God for the lovely weather that He so graciously gave us last week. It has been a particularly bleak winter and the bright sunshine was a great boost for all of us! There might be a **Fr. McKenna** sighting at St. Gertrude's the weekend if the weather in Dallas is as bad as they are saying. Texans aren't used to the snow and ice since they rarely get it, so it really does impact travel down there. The weather is saying that we might get around 5 inches of snow, but they often predict storms that never happen, so don't let them scare you away from Mass. I am down in Florida where it is a little warmer. God willing, I will be back in time for the feast of our patron, St. Francis de Sales!

I was thinking of all of our Sebastians and Agneses on their feast days and praying for them. Happy belated feast day to each of them! **Fr. Brueggemann** tells me that his family, who owns a few sheep, had two lambs born on the feast of St. Agnes. How providential is that!

Bishop Nkamuke sent a report from Nigeria. It seems that **Fr. Ikhiemoh** has been quite ill and will have to go to Lagos to receive better treatment. Please keep him in your prayers. His Excellency and the Fathers have been doing much to start a new school in one of their missions and have (or will) purchase a piece of land for it. The parents have already taken their kids out of the state schools and are ready to make this happen. Bishop just had his car give out on him and is forced to get a new one. Thanks to some benefactors he has the money to be able to do so. Not much has changed with regard to the persecutions in Nigeria so we must keep up our prayers. God does hear them!

Fr. Martín's mother died on the feast of St. Agnes, January 21st. Remember her soul in your prayers. **Fr. Contreras'** mother is ill as well. While you pray for their mothers, pray also for the priests. It is never easy to lose a mother. **Fr. Siordia** asked for Confirmations in Cocoyoc this summer. As of now, it looks like there will be long trip to Mexico for Confirmations at the chapels of Fr. Martín, Fr. Siordia, and **Fr. Mardones**. In November, the yearly trip to **Fr. Arnoldo's** chapel in Tijuana and hopefully La Paz. We are hoping to finish planning a trip to India and the Philippines as well. It looks like a busy year for the missions. Deo gratias et Mariae!

Report cards were passed out on Thursday and the school children did a fine job this quarter. It would be nice to hear from time to time how the homeschoolers are doing. I get little snippets of information from

the kids every now and again and all seems very positive.

GOSPEL MEDITATION

Today the Church admires the faith of the Roman centurion. He has not been prepared for the coming of Christ by the prophets, the Scriptures, or the miracles wrought by God to strengthen the faith of His people. And yet he believes. He not only believes that Christ can heal his servant, but is persuaded that it is not even necessary for Christ to come down to his house; His mere word will suffice. In fact, his great reverence for the Person of Christ leads him to believe that it would be an indignity for Christ to enter his house.

...The workings of grace are indeed mysterious. “I will have mercy on whom I will have mercy; and I will show mercy to whom I will show mercy” (Rom 9:16). And the apostle continues: “So then it is not of him that willeth, nor of him that runneth, but of God that showeth mercy” (Rom 9:16). If, then, we have been called to the Kingdom of God, it is not of our own doing nor because of our worthiness, but because of the mercy of God. How wonderful is God’s mercy toward us!
